Two Bloomington people were present at the historic scene in Springfield on Thursday, when Gov. Dunne signed the bill giving women the right to vote in this state. The above pic-

ture of the scene shows Bert H. McCann, of this city, standing at the extreme right of the picture, with his hand on the back of the chair. Mrs. Antoinette Funk, formerly of Bloom-

ington, is shown at the farther side of the table, in the left center of the picture. Mrs. Funk was one of the chief lobbyists for the passage of the bill.
